THE GLOBAL HEALTH INSTITUTE

The Global Health Institute (GHI) at the American University of Beirut was formally established in July 2017. As the first such institute in the Middle East and North Africa region, GHI aims to address global health challenges with a focus on context and sustainable impact by employing an interdisciplinary approach.

The primary focus of GHI are challenges that are affecting the MENA region, but have relevance to and impact on other regions in the Global South. GHI has three divisions: GHI Programs, GHI Academy and GHI Assist.

GHI Programs, the research and advocacy division of GHI, generates evidence-based solutions to global health challenges that are relevant to the MENA region. GHI Programs currently consists of the Conflict Medicine Program, the Refugee Health Program and the E-Sahha Program.

GHI Academy, the capacity building division of GHI, advances global health literacy and leadership through innovative delivery of contextualized capacity building initiatives.

GHI ASSIST, the service division of GHI, designs, implements and evaluates specialized services and initiatives for global health challenges affecting the MENA region.

THE CONSORTIUM OF UNIVERSITIES FOR GLOBAL HEALTH

The Consortium of Universities for Global Health (CUGH) is a rapidly growing Washington, DC based organization of over 145 academic institutions and other organizations from around the world engaged in addressing global health challenges.

CUGH supports academic institutions and partners to improve the wellbeing of people and the planet through education, research, service, and advocacy.

ABOUT THE GLOBAL HEALTH FORUM 2018

The past decades have witnessed significant strides in global health, yet around two thirds of total deaths worldwide are attributed to preventable and treatable diseases, with the highest burden found in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs) and among women and children.

Innovative approaches and technologies play a vital role in saving lives, improving overall health outcomes around the world and achieving the sustainable development goals (SDGs).

The Global Health Forum aims to draw special attention to global health challenges in LMICs most of which are geographically located in the Global South. The overarching theme of the first biennial global health forum is "Innovative Approaches to Global Health Challenges in Low and Middle-Income Countries".

The forum will be organized by the Global Health Institute in collaboration with the Consortium of Universities for Global Health.

FORUM OBJECTIVES

- Create an open platform for innovators among policy makers, global health professionals, academics and the private sector to evaluate and anticipate global health challenges pertaining to LMIC
- Convene stakeholders from various disciplines to share innovative ideas and practical cases to address global health challenges in the LMIC context


