Certificate Description

The Online Certificate in Conflict Medicine was developed by the Global Health Institute at the American University of Beirut, in partnership with R4HC Consortium.

The Certificate in Conflict Medicine employs a contextualized approach to explore how medical care and research can be shaped and undertaken in settings of conflict and fragility.



Certificate Competencies

A learner who successfully completes the certificate in conflict medicine would be able to:

Identify the key theories, concepts, and stakeholders related to conflict medicine

Describe how conflicts and their corresponding ecologies of war impact individual and population health

Develop a theoretical understanding of the approaches and challenges around providing medical care in settings of conflict

Plan and design evidence-based approaches for conducting health research in conflict

Recognize the landscape and challenges of major health themes in conflict: cancer, infectious diseases, and war wounds

Certificate Structure

The *Certificate in Conflict Medicine* tackles the major themes in conflict medicine and health. All certificate courses more than 20 hours to complete. To obtain the certificate, each learner must complete a total of four courses:

- 1 Introduction to conflict medicine
- 2 Medical care and knowledge in conflict
- 3 Health research methods in conflict
- 4 For the fourth course, learners can choose one of the below courses:
 - War wounds
 - Infectious diseases in conflict
 - Cancer in conflict

The certificate is designed for medical practitioners, nurses, medical trainees, medical and nursing students, and other allied health professionals.

Courses Components

Each certificate *course* includes the following components:



Certificate Core Courses



GCCM 201 | Introduction to Conflict Medicine

The Introduction to Conflict Medicine course provides a basic conceptual knowledge on how conflicts and their corresponding ecologies of war impact individual and population health.



GCCM 202 | Medical Care and Knowledge in Conflict

The Medical Care and Knowledge in Conflict course delivers an in-depth knowledge about the landscape, needs, and challenges around providing medical care in times of conflict.



GCCM 203 | Health Research Methods in Conflict

The Health Research Methods in Conflict course highlights the complexities of conducting research in conflict, including research organization, access, data collection and ethics.

Certificate Specialty Courses



GCCM 301 | War Wounds

The War Wounds course brings forth an in-depth description of the clinical manifestations and management strategies of war wounds and associated complications



GCCM 302 | Infectious Diseases in Conflict

The Infectious Diseases in Conflict course sheds light on the status, challenges, and needs around infectious diseases in the context of conflict, especially in the Middle East and North Africa region.



GCCM 303 | Cancer in Conflict

The Cancer in Conflict course delivers an overview of the interplay between conflict and cancer control, prevention, and care provision, followed by approaches to address the challenges of cancer care and research in conflict settings.
